## 6. Debrief August 4, 2024 Polar Park Blind Awareness Day. (Comm. Myska)

Visually Impaired services providers asked Polar Park to have a Blind Awareness Day on August 4<sup>th</sup>.to enjoy a ball game for blind youth and other Visually Impaired people (VIP). Eye Audio Radio provides audio description which explains what is happing on the field that others see.

There was a tabling event featuring the Programs that assist the Visually Impaired People. The tables were off to the side where people did not see them. The accessibility issues at Polar Park continue.

The locale Beep Baseball Team was also present. Beep basketball is people who are Bind or blindfolded play basketball.

The hope was to have an announcement on the Jumbotron which identifies the day and gives the sense this is an official day. This did not happen. The provider group hope this will be an annual event like the Deaf Day.

In conclusion, t the annual accessibility review at Polar Park, the AAC may want

to talk with George Lorin about hosting a Blind Awareness Day.

Question: Is this an annual event?

Response: this is the first year and was for the most part funded by The Memorial Foundation for the Blind which was establish in the early1900s. To be used for the Blind and Visually Impaired in Central Massachusetts. This day was to introduce youth to baseball who have never been able to see. May the Commission would want to have an all-abilities day and work with Mass. Office on Disability.

# 7. Action taken for two requests for use of Union Station for their event that were not disability related

The office received two requests for the use of Union Station Grand Hall. One came thru email wanting to hold a baby shower for military related families. The other was requested via a phone call. AAC leadership was consulted and agreed neither request meet the requirement for free use of the hall. Staff checked with Public Facilities Dept. to clarify and was told he restaurant in Union Sation had responsibility for booking the hall.
